



As Supply Officer, Lcdr F. W. McKay, has the tremendous responsibility of procuring, receiving, stowing, issuing and accounting for all general stores, equipment, repair parts for machinery, electronic equipment, ordnance material, ship's store stock, provisions, clothing and small stores.
