Vice Admiral S.R. Foley relieved Vice Admiral Robert B. Baldwin as Commander U.S. SEVENTH Fleet on May 26, 1978. Operating in the Western Pacific since its inception in 1943, the SEVENTH Fleet is one of the oldest and proudest military units afloat. Vice Admiral Foley is assisted in his role as an administrator and decision-maker by a sizeable staff which includes representatives from all the U.S. Armed Forces.
