Composed of Air Operations, Aerology, Photo Lab, Intelligence and the Operations Department Administrative section, OA Division represents the center of the ORISKANY'S Air Operations. These sections gather, evaluate and distribute information pertinent to the success of an air strike.

OE Division's mission is to maintain and repair the complex electronic equipment synonymous with modern military operations.

OI Division is the eyes of our ship, furnishing lookouts to keep the bridge informed of any surface or air contacts.
