

BORN ABOUT 1744 IN DONEGAL, IRELAND, GUS-TAVUS CONYNGHAM COMMANDED THE MERCHANT BRIG, CHARMING PEGGY, IN 1775. WHEN HIS SHIP WAS INTERNED IN EUROPE, CONYNGHAM SOUGHT AND ON 1 MARCH 1777 OBTAINED A CAPTAIN'S COMMISSION IN THE CONTINENTAL NAVY. AS COM-MANDING OFFICER, SUCCESSIVELY OF, SURPRISE AND REVENGE, HE BECAME A TERROR TO BRITISH SHIPPING. HE WAS CAPTURED IN 1779, ESCAPED TO EUROPE, AND WAS RECAPTURED WHILE RE-TURNING TO AMERICA IN 1780. EXCHANGED A YEAR LATER, HE WAS IN FRANCE PREPARING TO CRUISE AGAINST THE BRITISH WHEN THE WAR ENDED. HE RETURNED TO THE MERCHANT SER-VICE AND COMMANDED THE ARMED BRIG, MARIA, DURING THE QUASI-WAR WITH FRANCE. AS A MEM-BER OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF PHILADELPHIA, HE ASSISTED IN THE DEFENSE OF THAT CITY DURING THE WAR OF 1812. CAPTAIN CONYNGHAM DIED 27 NOVEMBER 1819, AT PHILADELPHIA, PEN-NSYLVANIA.
