Master Chief Bonilla enlisted in the U. S.
Navy in July 1983. After completion of
Recruit Training and Machinist Mate Class
'A' School in Great Lakes, Illinois, he
reported to Nuclear Field Power School in
Orlando, Florida. After completion of
training at Nuclear Power Training Unit in
Ballston Spa, New York, in April 1985, he
reported to the USS Theodore Roosevelt
(CVN 71) serving as a plank owner and
Leading Petty Officer for #1 propulsion plant.

In June 1990, he reported to the USS
Enterprise (CVN 65) serving as Leading Petty
Officer for #1 propulsion plant during a
complex refueling overall where he qualified
Enlisted Surface Warfare Specialist, Enlisted
Aviation Warfare Specialist and promoted to
Chief Petty Officer. In October 1992, he
reported to Navy Nuclear Power Training
Command as the Senior Instructor for the
Basic Machinery Division and Senior
Machinist Mate Section Advisor for the
Machinist Mate Department. During this
