
# UNDERWAY REFUELING








About every third day, late in the afternoon, we refueled. It's tough work and each man has his own job to do. Even after the hookup is complete and "commence pumping" is passed all hands keep a sharp eye out for possible danger.













#### PERSONNEL TRANSFER

is an exacting skill we perfected quite well. It takes real teamwork to transfer people between the 100 feet of ocean that separates two ships.



#### REARMING

Although we rearmed only once, it was heavy, cold and wet work. Each projectile weighs 70 lbs and after handling over 300 we had put in a full days work.





#### REPLENISHMENT

We brought aboard both fresh foods and dry provisions. They came aboard by some of the most modern methods, hi-line or VERTREP, but once aboard it was good old Norwegian Steam that got the goods stored below.





# **HELO OPERATIONS**

"Now set Flight Quarters to ..." was heard many times each day while on station. We conducted over 400 landings and launchings and over 200 refuelings and our efforts resulted in numerous "well dones" from the aircraft crews we worked with.



## V.I.P. VISITS







On January 10th Under Secretary of the Navy Honorable Robert H. B. Baldwin accompanied by the Commander of the U.S. SEVENTH Fleet VADM John J. Hyland visited the ship. They

were briefed on the ships' operations and given a tour of CIC. This was the first of many visits paid to MAHAN by high ranking officials and officers during the cruise.





Commander Cruiser Destroyer Force, Pacific, RADM Freeman came aboard on May 6th while we were being relieved on station by USS LONG BEACH (CAG(N)9). RADM Freeman talked with officers in the wardroom about the U.S. role in VietNamand Iter addressed the crew on the general announcing system.



Our guest list was further increased by a visit from the Commander of the U. S. FIRST Fleet Vice Admiral Bernard F. Roeder. VADM Roeder's command consists of training ships off the West coast of the U. S. for combat in Viet Nam.



Lt. General Momyer, Commander of the U. S. SEVENTH Air Force in Viet Nam also visited us. MAHAN worked quite closely with the Air Force and General Momayer strengthening Navy - Air Force understanding and cooperation.

RADM Mark Woods, Commander of Cruiser-Destroyer Flotilla NINE and two other officials were also our guests this day.
